Long story, short: We like our Club.


Biggest gripe: Ammo's too expensive.

Earlier this year we invited club members to fill out a short survey designed to shed light on how we use the club, what we like best about it and how we could improve it.




### Percentage of respondents using these facilities:




#### Days per year these facilities are used:

Matt proceeded to break 17 of the 25 targets thrown in his first-ever string.

A few weeks later, Matt enrolled in our NRA Basic Shotgun class and it was apparent that the natural talent he displayed on Field Day was no fluke.

Since that time he has kept up his practice and persevered through each of the NRA marksmanship awards until reaching the final category of Distinguished Expert on June 8th of this year.

We are proud to present Matt with his award at the General Membership meeting on June 24. We know his grandfather and his mother, Maria Gallagher, are just as impressed as we are.

Matt is the club's second junior shooter to achieve this signal honor.
