President's Report to Members

With the input from our members and committee chairs, the Board has decided to proceed with the following six Capital improvements to our club for 2011. To conserve money, and do as much of the work ourselves, work will proceed over the summer. The projects are: Replace the heater and air conditioning in the club house with a modern efficient system, possibly using geo-thermal. This may include new insulation in the attic. Replace the roof on the 25-yard range and continue replacing the shooting benches on the ranges. Increase and improve the club house parking area by 24 spaces using 4"-6" of slag as a base, the estimated cost is \$5,000. New baffles on the 75-yard range which will improve the range safety. The cost for the 100-yard range was \$7,300 plus a lot of work by members. Rebuild the road to the pond with parking spaces so that members can drive down. This will also allow the stocking truck better access. Improvements to the trap range. This basically involves repairs to the 5-position trap and is awaiting a decision by the trap committee. We also have a suggestion for range improvements which is still in the planning stage by the committee.

Our goal is to continually improve the club, add various activities and training that is suggested by club members. If you have a question or suggestion please direct it to the activity chairman whose phone or e-mail address is listed. The activities can be open to the public, such as the trap range and the ISPC matches, and should generate enough revenue to cover the cost to the club.

Proposed change to the Club Bylaws (Note this was passed 6/28 *(Editor)*

(The following change was proposed by the Membership Committee and approved by the Officers and Board for the members to vote on)

Current SCCS&FA Bylaws

Article 1

Section 4. Expiration Date

Members who do not pay their dues prior to February 1 of each calendar year, shall pay a late fee. Any member failing to renew their membership prior to June 30 of each calendar year, must reapply for membership to the association, attend the new member orientation and repay the initiation fee in full.

SCCS&FA Bylaws

Article 1

Section 4. Expiration Date

All memberships expire on September 30 of each year. Members who do not pay their dues prior to December 31 of each calendar year, will be dropped from the membership rolls and must reapply for membership to the association, attend the new member orientation and pay the initiation fee in full.

Striking the line "shall pay a late fee. Any member failing to renew their membership prior to June 30 of each calendar year", changing February 1 to December 31 and adding the wording "All memberships expire on September 30 of each year." As the beginning line and "will be dropped from the membership rolls" after the line "December 31 of each calendar year".

Membership Renewal Deadline

Effective immediately:

As of April 26, 2011 there is a new procedure to follow for all persons wishing to join as members of Southern Chester County Sportsmen's & Farmers' Association.

1) Prospective members **must** pre-register in advance to the membership director no later than 2 days (48 hours) before the next new member orientation by contacting the membership director - Amy Hutchins (302)998-5450 or membership@sccsfa.org.

2) New members are to arrive at the clubhouse at 6pm & no one will be admitted after 7pm.

3) Persons who are pre-registered & do not show up for the prospective new member orientation will have to pre-register again for the following month.

4) Persons who have not pre-registered will not be admitted for that month's new member orientation.

We will accept up to 30 members per month. As of this month our membership stands at 1222, having doubled in the last 5 years and tripled in the last 12. In order to provide the review of Club rules and other information we must limit the monthly attendance, in the last 2 months had over 50 new members apply each month.

2011 USPSA Match

Southern Chester County Practical Shooters Association (SCCPSA) is one of some 12 clubs in the Mid Atlantic Section. We hold eight matches per year, one match per month, March through October on the third Saturday of the month. The 2011 match schedule is: March 19, April 16, May 21, June 18, July 16, August 20, September 17, and October 15. The SCCSFA 15, 25, 50, and 75 yard ranges will be used for each match. Registration starts at 10 AM, walk through at 10:45 AM and the matches start promptly at 11 AM.



The competition covered 6 different scenarios on six ranges. 61 Contestants participated. Both time and accuracy count in these matches.



Down they go

Pre-registration is not required. These matches are open to the public and the entrance fee is \$20 for USPSA members, \$5 for Juniors and \$25 for nonmembers. Non-members may join USPSA for \$40 and shoot the match for free. We average about 50 competitors per match and we're usually done about 3:00 PM. Matches usually consist of 5 stages requiring 100+ rounds (you'll want to bring at least 150 to be sure of having enough). If you have not competed in a USPSA match before you will need to be safety checked. First time competitors need to see me before 10 AM. A Range Officer will look over your equipment to make sure it complies with the rules (your holster must cover your trigger guard, for example). You will learn the range commands that the RO will be using while you are on the firing line. And you will have to do a couple of live fire drills to show the RO that you can handle your firearm safely. Ability counts not age.

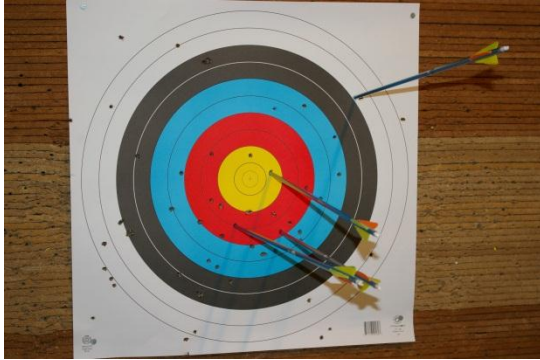

Youth League: anyone knowing a youth that would like to shoot on the Saturday Target league also sign up on the notice also in the archery range.

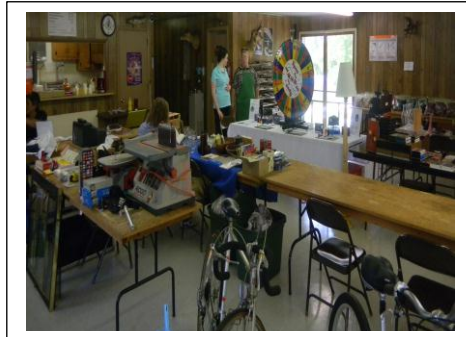

Legislative Report

Delaware – Governor Markell’s overbroad (26% of all adults) proposal to mandate reporting of “mental illness” to the NICS background check database has run into headwinds after passing one chamber of the legislature. It seems citizen calls and letters have been effective in slowing a headlong rush to passage in the Tucson hysteria. With the session to end June 30th keep the pressure on your legislators to avoid midnight deals. (*Editor note: as of now it did not pass*)

Pennsylvania – Governor Tom Corbert signed the “Castle Doctrine” today which becomes law in 60 days. A great day for us.

New York State – A new bill would require registration of all guns with both the county and the state at a per gun cost of \$15.00, plus \$10 for each annual renewal. Required information includes the location of each firearm. In NYC a civil rights lawsuit against Mayor Bloomberg challenges the city’s \$340.00 fee for a permit to keep a gun in the owner’s home. The legal fee limit elsewhere in New York State is \$10.00, but NYC is exempt.
