When coming down the lane to the Lake, you will immediately notice a change on both sides. On the northside, going up the hill to the Trap field, all the dead and fallen trees were removed, as well as the overgrown vegetation. The abandoned road to the Lake was leveled out and the entire area planted with Hi-Mark Tall Fescue for the deer and other wildlife in the area.
